Want to try pottery, but don't have a lot of free time? This is the perfect class for you. Come make a bird feeder. In this class you will use slab construction techniques to make a bird feeder using clay and a glass jar. Add some texture using stamps, doilies, lace, or a variety of other items and make yours unique. These will not be glazed but will have some stain added to show off the design. Once the clay is fired, it will be weather resistant.

You will be taught basic handbuilding skills to allow you to create anything you want...from house numbers, to critters, to simple designs using stamps or carving. We will glaze our pieces in the second class, and after firing, they will be durable and decorate your garden for years to come.

Beginning Wheel Throwing

This 4-week class is especially designed for those who have never used the wheel or who are working on basic skills. The course includes wedging, centering clay, throwing basic bowl and cylinder forms, finishing & glazing. Each class will start with a demonstration of technique and then you will have time to practice. During the practice time, you will be given individual instruction as you work.



Beginning Handbuilding

Cost: \$100 plus a \$25 materials fee - \$125 total

"Handbuilding" is working with clay by hand using only simple tools, not the pottery wheel. Before potters had the wheel, they were creating beautiful pots and clay forms using clay, their hands and fingers, and basic hand tools. Join us for this 4-week class, where you will be instructed in the 3 basic methods of handbuilding: pinch, coil, and slab. Each week we will have a demonstration of a different technique and time for you to create using the techniques you have learned. The 4th session will be for glazing the pieces you created. The pieces will then be fired for pick up the following week.
