About our instructor: Beth Kilpatrick Aspray is a native North Carolinian who spent most of her life in the southern Appalachian mountains in Brevard. Her first memories were made in her sandbox and playing in the clay in a small creek where she formed plates and cups to dry in the sun. It is no wonder she was drawn to pottery as an adult.

Her first lessons were taught by David Wray at Carlwile-Dodson Studio, part of Mud Dabbers Pottery in Brevard. Other instructors were Wendy Elwell of Burnwell Pottery and John Dodson of Mud Dabbers. Beth became an apprentice at Mud Dabbers and worked there learning the workings of a production pottery and eventually teaching children and adults at Carwile-Dodson Studio. During this time, she was a full time 4th grade teacher at Brevard Elementary. In 2016 she opened Red Waters Studio in Autryville, NC, and began making pots full time.
